## *Google Keywords Tool Reveals the Truth*

As I began building my website, I used the invaluable tool, the

Google Adwords Keyword External Tool ([www.adwords.google.com/o/Targeting/Explorer](http://www.adwords.google.com/o/Targeting/Explorer)).

This is the best tool ever! Or one of the best tools ever.

What's great about this tool is that you can search the most popular keywords in the world in your given language. By putting in a keyword like "entrepreneurship" you get about 2.2 million searches globally. The word "entrepreneur" yields 2.7 searches, slightly higher. The the word "business" yields a whopping 101 million searches.

Why is this important?

Well for a novice SEO "expert" (and I say novice because there is still so much to learn) and I still don't consider myself a "techie", this information is profound because if you are building a website and you want lots of people to see it, you have to choose words that people are most likely to search.

I was in the process of finding out what type of keywords I could include in the meta tags so that more people could find my new Nonprofit Start up Course (portal) and I remembered that the first time I did this, I did a search for nonprofit and all things related to nonprofit and I began to think...wait a minute I am only putting words that only one million or less people would search.

Now, in normal thinking, one would think that one million is a large number in the internet world it isn't. I got really distracted and began to search words like Google and got a whopping 755 million global searches and I thought, "WOW! What else is getting major search results like that?"

I tried to plug other words in there that I thought most of the world would be concerned about like hunger, poverty, Starbucks, and nonprofits having less than 10 million searches. The big shocker for me was the famous answer that every Miss America contestant uses as the greatest concern, "World peace" came in at a low of 368,000; far less than even a half of a million searches.

I must say that it does not mean that people don't care of these issues, it just means that people may not care about them as much as Facebook which reaches approximately 3.76 billion searches worldwide per month.

I think these numbers really highlight really what people are thinking about the most, want to know more about, or have a greater priority for. Most of us have already become a slave to Facebook at one time or another or have admitted being addicted to it for various reasons, going through Facebook withdrawals, or just stopping altogether!

Maybe an ideal business would be a 12 step program for healing from Facebook? At least you are guaranteed to get some hits on your website if you have that type of product.
